Day 1: Quito - Coca - Napo River

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|  | Flight from Mariscal Sucre Airporte (Quito) to Francisco de Orellana Airport (Coca) |
|  | Transfer from Francisco de Orellana Airport (Coca) to Pier La Mision |
|  | A motorized canoe will take us along the Napo River, until we reach the M/V ANAKONDA. On the way we weill enjoy amazin views of the rainforest and Napo's riverside. |
|  | Enjoy the facilities of M/V ANAKONDA and the fascinating landscapes |
|  | Time to get adventurous and discover the amazing biodiversity of the rainforest in the dark. |

Day 2: Border with Peru - The heart of Yasuni

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|  | We will learn about the relationship between plants and animals while closely watching out for samples of Amazonia's fascinating biodiversity |
|  | Lunch on board the M/V ANAKONDA |
|  | A river canoe will take us along a outstanding river where we will encounter pink river dolphins, black caimans, anaconda, river turtles, monkeys and the well - known "Stinky Turkey". |
|  | In the afternoon, we will return to M/V ANAKONDA |

Day 3: Meeting the community - Activities onboard - Island Exploration



We will visit a school located on the banks of the Napo River, where we will have the opportunity to interact with children of a jungle community in Ecuador.



Lunch on board the M/V ANAKONDA



We will offer a lecture and documentary screening, and if time permits, learn about (and make) typical handicrafts of the area.



In the afternoon, we explore one of the largest river islands of the Napo River.

Day 4: Observation tower - Limoncocha Biological Reserve



Breakfast on board the M/V ANAKONDA



Visit an observation tower 100-feet high, built against a giant kapok tree. From the top of the tower, we will be blessed with a unique perspective of the forest, looming over the treetops and the greatness of the Amazon Basin.



We visit Limoncocha Biological Reserve, a fascinating protected area where more than 478 bird species and several monkey species have been recorded.



We will have a chance to spot black caiman with the help of our flashlights.

Day 5: Return

Disembark the M/V ANAKONDA to take a motorized canoe that will take us to the Mision Pier in Coca



Transfer from Pier La Mision to Francisco de Orellana Airport (Coca)
